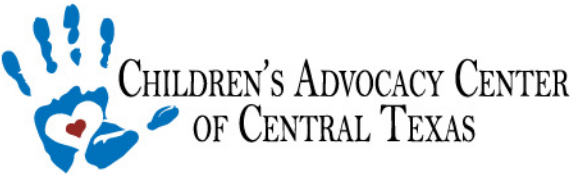


A WORD FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

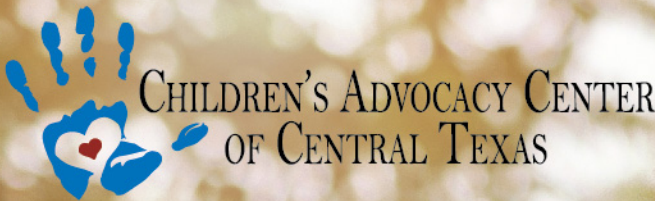

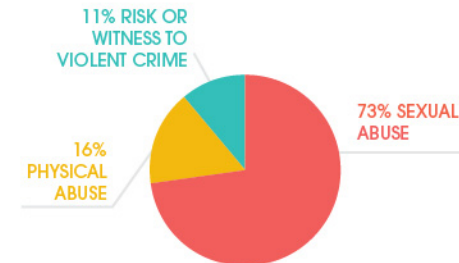

AGES OF CHILDREN INVOLVED IN INVESTIGATIONS



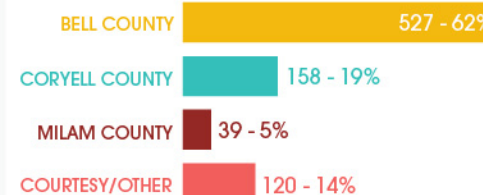
TYPES OF ABUSE



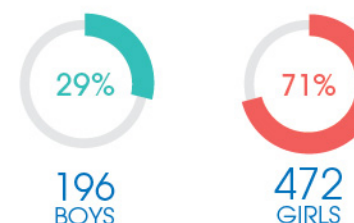
CHILDREN THAT KNEW THE ALLEGED OFFENDER
